## ACCREDITATION ASSESSMENT TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENT

A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will examine all aspects of the University of Florida Police Department's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. UFPD has to comply with approximately 98 standards in order to receive accredited status. Many of the standards are critical to life, health and safety issues.

As part of the assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. A copy of the standards manual is available through UFPD's Records Division in Gainesville at (352) 392-6651 or email ufpdrecords@admin.ufl.edu.

As part of the assessment, agency personnel and members of the community are invited to offer comments at a telephonic public commentary session by calling (352) 273-3335 on Tuesday, April 27, 2021 at between the hours of 1:00 PM - 3:00 PM.

The assessment team is composed of law enforcement practitioners from similar agencies. The assessors will review written materials; interview individuals; and visit offices and other areas where compliance can be witnessed.

Once the Commission's assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the full Commission, which will then determine if the agency is to receive accredited status. UFPD's accreditation is valid for 3 years. Verification by the team that UFPD meets the Commission's standards is part of a voluntary process to gain or maintain accreditation--a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence.
