# Police Interaction Tips



- Remember the officer wants to help and protect you.
- Be calm and courteous.
- Keep your hands where the officer can see them.
- Answer all questions truthfully.
- Have your identification readily available.
- **WHEN DRIVING:** Have your driver license, registration, and proof of insurance readily available.
- No need to argue about signing a citation since you are acknowledging receipt, not that you agree with the citation.
- Remember, most of the time the officer just wants to ask you questions and you are NOT in trouble.
- Officers' can enter/search your residence or vehicle if they:
  - Have probable cause
  - Believe a life is in danger
  - Have a search warrant

# Your Rights



- US Constitutional Rights (Amendments) that apply to international students:
  - 1st- freedom of expression
  - 4th- protection from unreasonable search & seizure
  - 5th - protection against self-incrimination
  - 14th- guarantee of “due process” or “equal protection” under the law
- You can ask the officers for their name and badge/ID number before you open the door.
- You can ask why they are at your door before opening it.
- You can ask why they are stopping you.
- You have the right to take your case to court if you are charged with a crime.



# SNAP

Student Nighttime Auxiliary Patrol



- SNAP is a free, nightly, campus safety and transportation service.
- SNAP includes point-to-point vehicular service.
- Employees are equipped with a radio and picture ID.
